Your Conference Key Note Speakers

Dr Jenny Gamble - Associate Professor of Midwifery at Griffith University.

Jenny is an Australian College of Midwives Qld State Executive member and has a strong profile as a professional leader in reforming maternity services and strengthening midwifery.



Dr Gamble’s research program has focused on a critical analysis of existing maternity practices (e.g., caesarean section rates, emotional care provided to women); intervention studies to improve maternity care; cost effectiveness studies; and enhancing the role of

midwives (e.g., studies investigating education strategies).

Associate Professor Gamble has published over 39 book chapters and journal articles based on her research. She is currently chief investigator in funded research projects worth over \$1.2 million including a NHMRC funded study (\$650K) to test a midwife-led counselling intervention for childbearing women suffering emotional distress. She supervises both post-graduate and post-doctoral researchers.

She is a reviewer for midwifery academic journals, an industry adviser, and assessor for both University and national research grants.

Professor Sue Kildea

Chair of Midwifery - Australian Catholic University & Mater Mothers' Hospital Mater Health Services Sue

Sue holds a Clinical Chair in midwifery and is a joint appointment between the Mater Health Services Brisbane and the Australian Catholic University. She has extensive clinical experience in primary health care models and women's health in rural and remote areas of Australia and is one of Australia's leading advocates for maternity service reform, promoting the return of birthing services to rural and remote areas. Sue's interests are in safety, quality and professional collaboration in maternity care. She has a particular interest in increasing the capacity of the health workforce to maximise their effectiveness to make a difference to the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families. Sue was the Perinatal Health Analyst who compiled the Maternal Deaths in Australian Report, 2000-02. In 2004 she was awarded the UTS Human Rights Award for her contribution to advancing reconciliation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous Australians during her PhD work. Sue is the Vice President of CRANAplus, who she represented during the development of the National Framework for Rural Maternity Services.



Dr. Julie Jomeen. University of Hull United Kingdom



Julie Jomeen is both a qualified nurse and midwife, she has worked at both clinical and strategic levels within the maternity services in the UK and is now Associate Dean for Research and Scholarship in the Faculty of Health and Social Care at the University of Hull. Julie combines her passion for research with an ongoing passion for midwifery and for promoting optimal experiences for women throughout their maternity experience. Julie has an ongoing stream of both research and clinical work on psychological health outcomes for women across the maternity spectrum and midwives/health practitioners knowledge, perceptions and practice in relation to perinatal mental health Other research projects include, technology and practitioner decision making; the impact of interprofessional and intraprofessional relationships on consumer choice in maternity care; obesity in pregnancy and

postpartum weight retention and screening for alcohol use in pregnancy as well as professionalism/professional behaviour in nursing/midwifery.

Professor Michael Humphrey Clinical Adviser in the Office of Rural and Remote Health Queensland



Professor Michael Humphrey is an academic obstetrician who currently holds positions as Clinical Adviser in the Office of Rural and Remote Health (primary functions are related to examining the available range of maternity service models suitable for safe and sustainable service delivery in rural and remote Queensland communities) and Senior Medical Coordinator (Obstetrics), Retrieval Services Queensland, and Chairs the Queensland maternal and Perinatal Quality Council. He held the post of Clinical CEO in Cairns and Hinterland Health Service District from March 2007 to March 2009, and has previously held Chairs in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at James Cook University, The University of Queensland and The University of Tasmania. His PhD thesis related to delivery of appropriate antenatal care to indigenous women in Cape York.

Conference dinner and disco – at the Southport Yacht Club

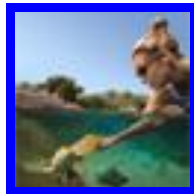
Not to be missed this will be the highlight of the social program !!
